



2017 TRAIL CLOSURES AND DETOURS

(information provided by municipalities)

Dear Bike to Work Day commuters,

As Bike to Work Day approaches, note various trail closures and detours throughout the metro area. Although this information has been provided by local municipalities, it should not be considered all-inclusive. Please contact your local city or county public works department for more information. This document will be updated as municipalities provide further information.

COUNTIES

Jefferson County:

We are doing over lay and shouldering work on the Hampden Avenue frontage road on the south side of US 285 between Kipling Street and Wadsworth Boulevard.

We will also have traffic control in place on Chatfield Avenue between Pierce and Kendall Streets parallel to the Columbine Trail.

Multi-Jurisdictional Closure:

Beginning in July, the Mary Carter Greenway Trail will begin to have intermittent flagging operations and full closures under the South Platte River Bridge for replacement of the existing eastbound and westbound bridges.

Detour routes are currently being optimized in coordination with local parks and recreation organizations.

CITIES

Commerce City:

The Fernald Trail is closed due to the construction of the Regional Transportation District's North Metro Rail Line.



The South Platte River Trail can be accessed via the Sand Creek Trail (the trails meet around E. 64th Ave. and I-270, but there is not a trailhead where they meet.)

There are trailheads with parking at E. 64th Ave. and York St., E. 74th Ave. just west of the river, and E. 88th Ave. and Colorado Blvd.

South Broadway Bikeway Study Area: There will be construction activity at Dakota Avenue from March 29 to 31. One lane of the bikeway will remain open – please be careful and watch out for pedestrians and any construction activity.

15th Street Bikeway: Expect construction activities and detours at California and Arapahoe Streets throughout 2017 as new developments are constructed.

Bikers should not use Brighton Boulevard between 44th and 29th streets as there is only one lane of traffic and really no space for bikes.

McFarland Drive is closed to through travel from Arkins Court to 44th Street.

33rd Street: riders are detoured onto Arkins between 31 and 38.

Golden:

Highlands Ranch:



The Marcy Gulch Trail will be closed from the east side of South Broadway east to Gateway Drive due to water line construction.

The Mountain Vista Trail will be open, with some detours, from Gateway Drive east to Summit View Parkway.

Due to construction of a new park, there is a long-term trail closure of the St. Vrain Greenway trail from Main Street to Martin Street, and then from east of Martin Street to where the St. Vrain Greenway joins with the Left Hand Creek Greenway. These closures are expected to remain in effect until Spring 2018. Please see the news release [here](#) for more information.

Superior:

Bypass lanes are in place on McCaslin Boulevard, between Marshall Road and Rock Creek Parkway, to divert traffic around the construction of a roundabout which will serve the Superior Town Center. Northbound and southbound traffic have two vehicle lanes and a bicycle lane. There is a temporary sidewalk to the east of the northbound lanes. Be advised that the speed limit has been reduced from 40 mph to 25 mph in this area, and there will be temporary stops for construction vehicle crossings.

The trail between 100th Ave. and 104th Ave. on the west side of the railroad tracks is closed due to work on the 104th Ave. FasTracks Station.

The trail north of 88th Ave. along Welby Rd. has been removed and will be rebuilt to the 88th Ave. FasTracks Station.

Westminster:

The Little Dry Creek Trail underpasses at Lowell Blvd and Federal Blvd will still be closed next week. So are rerouting cyclist through Tennyson, Lowell, or Midtown.
